

TRAP NEUTER RETURN (TNR)

What are feral cats?

Free roaming. You might call her an alley cat, a barn cat, or a street cat. No matter how you say it, she is a feral cat, living a valued life outside. Because she has not been fixed, she has 3-4 litters a year, eventually forming colonies. Cats make their home wherever they can find food and shelter; most of them avoiding human contact whenever possible. Tomcats prowl for mates, females become pregnant, and the cycle of reproduction continues. TNR works. NO MORE KITTENS! Populations are gradually reduced. The annoying behaviors of mating cats, such as yowling or fighting, stop. The cats are vaccinated against disease, left ear-tipped for ID purposes and are returned to their colony.

- Microchip: \$20 at time of surgery for pets. Registration included.
- Pre- surgery bloodwork: \$60, pets over 6 years old
- Extra charges for cryptorchid males or dogs weighing over 70 lbs.

Kittens: 12-16 weeks

Puppies: 12-16 weeks

Females

Eliminates the constant crying and nervous pacing of female cats; the messiness of female dog heat cycle.

Nearly eliminates breast, ovarian and uterine cancer and infections.

Eliminates pregnancy - 100%

Males

Decreases urine marking, aggressiveness, humping and urge to roam.

Male cats and dogs, especially if fixed before sexual maturity, tend to be less aggressive and more affectionate.

Decreases cancer of testicles and enlarged prostate.
